

Background

Problems of misbalanced educational paths of academic and vocational training In the participating countries, there is a clear mismatch between the educational systems and the demands of the labour markets, which is causing high youth unemployment: Today one of six young Europeans on the labour market cannot find a job.

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Aims

To strengthen the key practical competences and skills of young people during their study at secondary vocational schools (VET institutions) and also after their graduation to be more competitive and better prepared for labour market in order to better utilize local human resources, to increase economic development of rural areas and to prevent brain drain.
